A great and surprising spiritual awakening is happening in Baptist churches in Cuba right now!

Since 1990, the number of churches in Cuba has grown by 450%. The number of baptisms has risen by over 500%. And the number of prayer groups and total church memberships have climbed in equally high numbers.

After decades of harsh restrictions, "the church of God has risen from the ashes," says a retired Cuban church leader who witnessed the remarkable change firsthand. "In God's time, the hearts of so many people have been opened up to the goodness of the gospel."



#### New Small Group Bible Study Series

Adam Hamilton's book, When Christians Get It WRONG, says that the majority of today's young adults who are disengaged from the church say they find the attitudes and behaviors as off putting. In fact 87% of them describe Christians as <u>judgmental</u> and 85% of them describe Christians as <u>hypocritical</u>.

They say they take issue with Christian doctrine (or belief) as it has been expressed to them by many Christians – doctrines relating to suffering, science and faith, the Bible, salvation and the final judgment particularly as it relates to non- Christians.

Hamilton invites Christians to examine their attitudes, actions and beliefs. And he offers a different way of understanding some very serious theological issues – related to the nature of God, scripture, science and faith, the religions of the world, and homosexuality – from what is often articulated by the loudest Christian voices in current culture.

I'm certain the book and the brief videos that accompany the book will provoke much discussion and hopefully shed more light than heat.

We hope to have the sessions in members' homes. However, we'll start the series on September 28 at 7 p.m. in our newly decorated "Upper Room" at the church.
