Dear friends at Franklin Park Baptist Church,

Lately I've been thinking of what the Bible says about beginning your morning with prayer and with the Lord. Here are some key scriptures:

Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love, for I have put my trust in you. Show me the way I should go, for to you I entrust my life. – Psalm 143:8 NIV

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.- Lamentations 3;22-23 ESV

Weeping may last through the night, but joy comes with the morning. – Psalm 30:5

It is good to proclaim your unfailing love in the morning, your faithfulness in the evening. – Psalm 92:2

Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. – Mark 1;35\_NIV

Also, here are a couple of brief suggested prayers to get you started, and a couple of reminders from St Paul about our calling as followers of Jesus:

Lord, help me to honor you today in every meeting, in every chance encounter, in every decision, and in every word. Help me to express my love for you and your love for others.

Lord, often I am critical of others when my own standards need review. Compel me to judge others less and to look deeply at my own shortcomings. Help me to see the judgment and hypocrisy in my own life and help me to become the disciple you want me to be.

<u>Colossians 3:13-</u>14 Since God chose you to be the holy people whom he loves, you must clothe yourselves with tenderhearted mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. [13] You must make allowance for each other's faults and forgive the person who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others.


[14] And the most important piece of clothing you must wear is love. Love is what binds us all together in perfect harmony.

Ephesians 4:29-32 [29] Do not let any unwholesome (evil) talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. [30] And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. [31] Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. [32] Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

<u>1 Peter 3:8-9</u> [8] Finally, all of you, live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and humble[9] Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing.

May your October become a time of renewal and hope as we draw nearer to our God.

#### WHEN CHRISTIANS GET IT WRONG. By Adam Hamilton Wednesday s @ 7:00 PM

#### Week one. Sept . 28 When Christians are unchristian

Main idea: the critique of non-Christians that they perceive us to be judgmental, hypocritical, and unloving should serve as a warning that many of us have become the very Pharisees Jesus preached against. We get it right when we love rather than condemn those who are outside the church.

#### Week two Oct 5. Christians, science, and politics

Main idea: if we want to get it right in science and politics, we need to be open minded, humble, and teachable, recognizing that we do not have all the truth.

#### Week three. Oct. 12. When speaking of other religions

Main idea: the most powerful form of Christian witness is expressing authentic love, compassion, mercy, and kindness towards others.

#### Week four Oct. 19. When bad things happen

Main idea: if we want to get it right when it comes to how we speak and act in times of suffering, we need to carefully consider what we believe about how God works in the world and seek to be the hands, feet, and a voice of Jesus to those who are suffering.

#### Week five Oct. 26. In dealing with homosexuality

Main idea: we get it wrong when we speak and act in ways that bring harm and alienation to God's homosexual children; but we get it right, when despite our questions and uncertainty we express the love and welcome of Jesus Christ.

#### Week six Nov. 2. When Christians get it right

Main idea: when we Christians get it right, we love as Jesus loved, and that is a powerful witness that has the capacity to change the world.

# VALL HANGING

Make this with — and for — a special friend.

#### What you need:

- · Paper and pencil
- Scissors
- Cardboard
- · Aluminum foil
- · Tape
- Acrylic paint (red, blue, green)
- Paintbrushes
- Permanent marker
- Twine
- · A friend

#### What you do:

- Trace a palm-sized heart in the center of the paper. Cut out the heart to use as a stencil.
- Cover the cardboard with foil. Tape the heart stencil in the center.
- Fill in the heart "hole" with red paint. Let dry. Remove stencil.
- Cover your hand with blue paint, and make a handprint to one side of the heart. Cover your friend's hand with green paint and have him or her make a handprint to the other side of the heart. Let dry.
- Write "FRIENDS" at the top.
- On the back, tape twine to make a hanger.
