The impact of Jesus' birth is more far reaching than you may realize. Here are :

Six Ways Jesus' Birth Changed the World

<u>Children</u>. In the ancient world children were routinely left to die of exposure, particularly if they were girls. Jesus' treatment of and teachings about children led to the forbidding of such practices, as well as orphanages. <u>Education</u>. The ancient world loved education but tended to reserve it for the elite; the notion that every child bore God's image helped fuel the move for universal literacy. Love of learning led to monasteries. Universities such as Cambridge, Oxford and Harvard all began as Jesus-inspired efforts to love God with all one's mind.

Compassion. Jesus' compassion for the poor and the sick led to institutions for lepers, the beginning of modern-day hospitals. That's why even today, hospitals have names like "Good Samaritan." They were the world's first voluntary, charitable institutions. Humility. The ancient world did not value the virtue of humility. Jesus' life as a foot-washing servant would eventually lead to the adoption of humility as a widely admired virtue. Historian John Dickson writes,.."...it is unlikely that any of us would aspire to this virtue were it not for the historic impact of his crucifixion." Forgiveness. In the ancient world, virtue meant rewarding your friends and punishing your enemies. An alternative idea came from Galilee: what is best in life is to love your enemies, and see them reconciled to you. Humanitarian Reform. Jesus consistently championed the excluded. His inclusion of women led to a community to which women flocked in disproportionate numbers. Slaves-- up to a third of ancient populationsmight wander into a church fellowship and have a slaveowner wash their feet rather than beat them.

In addition to these is the impact His coming has on each of us personally. Because of him we are guided by the light of his love to become the people God calls us to be.




- Baking tray lined with wax paper

# **December Stewardship Thought**

# "God Has Given You A Gift "2 Corinthians 8:9

"Do we need to buy her a present ? Him, too ? "You don't need to get him / her a real expensive gift." "Well, they gave me a gift last year."

Have you heard any of those comments during the Christmas season? Our motives for buying some gifts may be based on courtesy, duty, or tradition – all of which may or may not be bad but certainly fall short of motives such as love or "because I want to." Sometimes we may not be sure what our motives are; we just think we have to give a gift.

The Bible makes clear that Christ's motive for giving Himself to and for us was that we "might become rich." The gift has been given – verified in history, recorded clearly by all the Gospel writers, and experienced by multitudes of believers. God gave His Son, who willingly gave Himself for us. His motive: that we might become rich – rich in faith, rich in Christ, rich in hope, rich in eternal life, and rich in love. There is only one explanation for such giving: grace, unearned and undeserved love of God for us. What a gift !
