Dear Friends at Franklin Park Baptist,



Because Jesus is the light of the world, his followers don't need to fear darkness or life's dark times. Make this nightlight to remind you of Jesus' light and presence.




What you need:

- Work area with good ventilation
- Mason jar
- Clear glue that works on glass
- Paintbrush
- Glass stones
- Tealight candle
- Lighter
- Adult supervision

What you do:

- Starting at the top of the jar, brush glue on a small section.
- Press glass stones onto the glue in rows. Let dry.
- Continue gluing stones, in small sections, until the entire jar is covered.
- When dry, place a candle inside. Light with adult help.
